If you would like to see what the issues are and or provide feedback on key initiatives you feel the City needs to focus on, then please attend one of our council meetings.

On a different note, October is one of my favorite months. Who does not love trick or treating? This year the Chamber of Commerce will be organizing the annual downtown event. It is on the 31st. There is a road project that is in King County but could have a fairly significant impact on Duvall citizens. King County Roads is repairing a section of West Snoqualmie Valley Road that was damaged by a landslide during the heavy rain in March 2014. The section of road that will be closed is on West Snoqualmie Valley Rd NE; 200 feet north of Novelty Hill (between the bottom of Novelty Hill Road and NE 124th). The closure is scheduled to begin at 6:30 a.m. Monday, October 5th and is scheduled to be a three (3) week closure. It will be a full road closure. Metro Transit's In Motion program is under way in Duvall, Carnation, and the Redmond Ridge area! The program provides opportunities for residents to try different ways of getting around by busing, walking, bicycling, or carpooling instead of driving alone, and rewarding them for doing so! Residents who pledge to drive less will receive their choice of a free two-week unlimited ORCA card or a travel mug.

The twelve week program will provide Duvall residents with the tools and information they need to begin exploring different travel options. In addition, participants who log switched drive alone trips will be entered into bi-weekly prize drawings for gift certificates to local businesses, such as The Grange Cafe, Ixtapa and Safeway.
