

MAIN STREET PROJECT UPDATE



October has been a busy month for the project with lots of storm and water line installation along the east side of the road. We've also installed a lot of pipe for the Joint Utility Trench which brings us closer to getting rid of those overhead wires. The beginning of November will see a full closure of Kennedy Drive for a week so we can completely re-grade and reconstruct

that roadway. Appropriate detours will be posted. Also, November could see our very first sections of curb line and sidewalk installed! It's a large project, with lots of work left to do; thank you for your continued patience.


