MAIN STREET PROJECT UPDATE

May, oh glorious May! Interwest, their sub-contractors and all of the utilities worked hard throughout the month of May to make some real progress. By now you've probably noticed the over-



head wires starting to disappear, which will ultimately make the road space feel much bigger and more open. By the time you read this, we may even have begun pulling poles out. As the poles and wires are cleared, we'll gain more room to complete portions of the work where poles were blocking progress. Also by the

time you read this we should have a good portion of sidewalk installed from Valley Street to Copper Hill Square. Come on down, take a walk and see firsthand how things are going.

June will see the completion of the utility undergrounding, wall construction and much of the sidewalk installation in the areas accessible to us. This is definitely a transition month as the project goes from an unfinished, deconstructed appearance to a more orderly one where it is clear how sidewalk, lighting, trees and landscaping will all fit together.

Remember, we do have one major work activity coming with the replacement of culverts at Thayer Creek, near and on NE 143rd Place. This work will involve a complete closure of SR 203 at that location for over a week. This is tentatively scheduled for mid-July. Detours will be provided around the work area. More information will be shared regarding this work as the details are finalized.
