It is hard to believe that this is the last month of summer before school starts. July was the start of SummerStage. We have had a couple of great bands and a larger turnout than last year. We also have several excellent bands scheduled in August. A problem that has come up is the amount of alcohol that folks are bringing into the park. I have been asked to assign a police officer to monitor the park for the concerts. I would rather not and would like to allow people to just enjoy the show, yet if the issue grows, I will have no choice. If you wish to drink at the event, please use the beer and wine garden. I appreciate your assistance in this matter.

One big change in Duvall is WAVE has rolled out its "Gigabyte Service". They now offer this speed in town. We know folks have struggled with WAVE in the past. We hope this new service will help everyone out, especially the home-based businesses. The current franchise agreement is up and the City has a technology committee made up of businesses and residents that are advising the Council and me on what key features and benefits they would like to see in a future agreement.

I am happy to report that the next big portion of the Main Street project is to complete the concrete work for the sidewalks and then later in the month, we hope to grind down the road for a future overlay. This will help remove the many of the bumps, etc. in the roadway.

A few upcoming events are Irwin Movies in the Park on August 5^{th} and the 12^{th} , Art in Bloom August 11^{th} - 13^{th} and the Farmers Market continues each Thursday through October.


ject to support them as our project heads to its final phases.

The concrete sub-contractor should be spending most of the month with us and you will see curb line completed and significant portions of sidewalk installed. We should also begin some of the landscaping that will start to give the project some character, and the work on "Rosenbach Corner" at NE 143rd will take shape. Toward the end of August we will grind asphalt and prep the whole roadway for paving (occurring early September). Throughout August you will see day to day changes; hope you're as excited as we are.

take up to 10 business days to reach us. Did you know the City offers an ACH Debit option? Your amount due can be automatically deducted from your checking or savings account each due date. You will still receive a bill that will show you how much will be deducted from your bank account.

To get the ACH Debits application, go to http://duvallwa.gov/DocumentCenter/View/87. You will need to provide a voided check.

Please turn in the application no later than the 15th of the month in which you wish to start the ACH Debits program.

City of Duvall Special Recycling Event Thank You!

Thank you to everyone who attended the recycling event on July 15th! We had a record turnout and collected tons of materials to be recycled.

Some questions that came up frequently this year: **Q-Would you do more than one event per year? A-**This event is fully funded through King County grants and unfortunately there are only enough funds for one event each year.

Q-Where can I dispose of paint?

A-If you have Latex paint to dispose of, simply remove the lid, let it dry out and add to your regular garbage. Oil based paints are considered hazardous waste and need to be taken to a Hazardous Wastemobile site. Visit www.hazwastehelp.org for upcoming events and more information on what other items are considered hazardous materials.

Q-Where can I recycle oil or batteries throughout the year?

A-Clean, used motor oil is accepted year round at our local Duvall Auto Parts store (limit 5 gallons per visit) and at most other auto parts stores in our area. Duvall Auto Parts will also accept vehicle and marine batteries for recycling. Other household batteries are accepted at our local True Value Hardware store.
