CITY OF DUVALL RECYCLING EVENT

It's that time of year again! The City of Duvall is sponsoring the annual Special Recycling Collection Event on Saturday, August 25th at Holy Innocents Church in Duvall. **Most items are free to recycle but there are user fees for certain items. There will be some changes to this year's event with regard to materials collected and user fees.** The Recycling Collection is open from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. or until full. All King County households are eligible to participate. The event is funded by grants from the Local Hazardous Waste Management Program in King County, King County Solid Waste Division, and the WA State Department of Ecology.

This year's accepted items are:

- Tires - *some fees apply*
- Motor Oil & Filters
- Antifreeze
- Document Shredding
- Lead Acid Batteries
- Alkaline Batteries
- Propane Tanks - *fee applies*
- Household Goods & Clothing
- Porcelain Toilets & Sinks - *fee applies*
- Appliances & Scrap Metal - *some fees apply*
- Refrigerators & Freezers - *fee applies*
- Computers/Electronics/Cell Phones
- TV Sets

When asked what drew him to the task, Quinn replied, “I wanted to be able to prove to people that I am a real Boy Scout. Quinn is a member of Boy Scout Troop 745 and actively participates with Venture Crew 215 on trips. Quinn met with the City in April 2017 to begin plans for a project that would give a lasting benefit to the community. For his project, he chose to construct an informational kiosk on site at the Farmstead. The kiosk will provide an opportunity to display general information for the site and upcoming activities.

He managed and encouraged a group of volunteers who completed 224.80 of man hours to the project. Working with people to schedule work parties helped him develop management skills.

Quinn is active in his high school band. After graduating he would like to attend the University of Washington or Colorado School of Mines for a degree in mechanical engineering.
