FIREWORKS REGULATIONS IN DUVALL

As the weather warms and BBQs start happening, we begin to think of summer and the 4th of July Holiday. Here is a reminder of the fireworks regulations within the city limits of Duvall.



According to Duvall Municipal Code 5.10.055, "It is unlawful for a person to ignite, discharge, use, or explode any fireworks in the City of Duvall except between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 11:00 p.m. on July 4th."

BATTEN ROAD SEWER EXTENSION



Work has begun along Batten Road where the City is installing about 1200 feet of new gravity sewer main and decommissioning an outdated lift station. The work includes a daily road closure to accommodate the deep excavation and large equipment. The allowed working hours will be Monday through Saturday from 7:00 a.m. – 6:00 p.m. Stay tuned later in August following this project when we expect King County's contractor to move in and resurface the roadway.

CITY OF DUVALL RECYCLING EVENT



It's that time of year again! The City of Duvall is sponsoring the annual Special Recycling Collection Event on Saturday, July 20th at Holy Innocents Church in Duvall. The event is open from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. or until full. All King County households are eligible to participate. The event is funded by grants from the Local Hazardous Waste Management Program in King County, King County Solid Waste Division, and the Washington State Department of Ecology. **Most items are free to recycle but there are user fees for certain items.
