I hope you all enjoyed the summer as much as my family and I did. I must say, it was a welcome surprise that the Western Washington wildfire season was much milder than originally forecast. As a result, we had a smoke free SummerStage season to celebrate the 19th year of the concert series. At the last concert in August, we were fortunate to have Cody Beebe and the Crooks with a special home-town guest, Austin Jenckes. Austin arrived in a Cedarcrest Redwolves uniform and surprised the largest crowd of the season, playing half the concert. Next year SummerStage will be celebrating its 20th year and we hope to put together a fantastic series in celebration.

Thank you to those that have relayed compliments on the new play equipment at Taylor Landing Park. Our King County Councilmember, Kathy Lambert, successfully procured the funding so that we could make much needed upgrades to the park. If you haven't checked it out, please do! It's a great place to take the kids for a picnic and playtime.

September also marks the start of the process of the City's first mid-biennial budget review. During this process, City staff will be looking at expenditures, new expenses, cost savings, staffing levels and revenue projections to make routine adjustments to the budget. Stay tuned in late spring 2020, as we will begin the process of the 2021-2022 budget.

Construction season is nearly over. Thank you for your patience as the roundabout and road improvements were made on Big Rock Road, and the sewer line/pavement overlay project was completed on Batten Road.

It is also time to start thinking about fall yard clean up. As the weather changes from summer to fall, leaves will begin to drop and clog up gutters and cover storm drain grates. Please don't blow your yard debris into the street, and help reduce urban flooding by keeping storm drains clear.

INTERSECTION VEGETATION MAINTENANCE

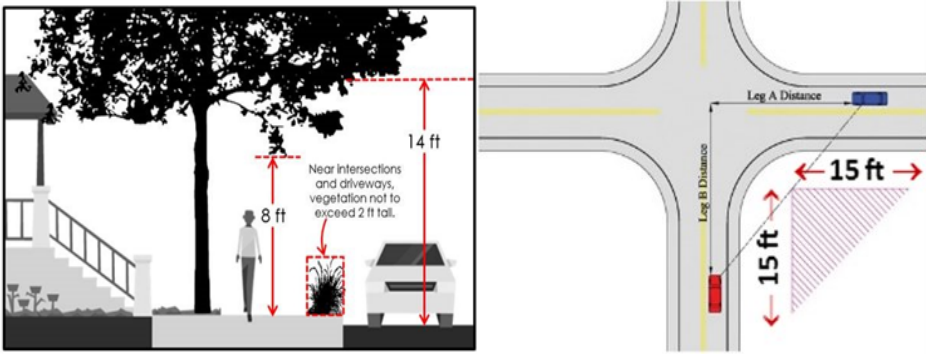
In the next 3 – 5 weeks, the City will begin trimming any intersections that have not been maintained by the property owner/tenant. Please note that the City’s tractor-mounted mowing arm can only complete coarse trimming and it will be the property owner’s responsibility to clean up all mowing debris.

Overgrown vegetation is a safety hazard when it blocks the view of traffic signs, signals, vehicles, or pedestrians. Maintaining and trimming your trees and other landscaping are effective ways that you can enhance your neighborhood safety.

It is the property owner’s responsibility to maintain clear passage along roads and sidewalks in accordance with Duvall Municipal Code 8.02.020 “Duty to remove vegetation and clear passage”.

We appreciate your cooperation in helping to improve road safety in Duvall. Please contact Public Works, 425-788-3434 ext. 8050 or Maintenance.Requests@duvallwa.gov if you would like to discuss the required work or if you have time constraints.
