WOODINVILLE-DUVALL ROAD CLOSURES

King County will continue bridge deck maintenance work on Woodinville-Duvall Road just west of town at the end of August 2012. The road will be closed daily between 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. Monday, August 27th through Friday, August 31st. On Saturday and Sunday, August 25th and 26th, there will be single lane closures from 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

Please be prepared to use other access routes (NE 124th Street or SR-203 north to 203rd St SE/Crescent Lake Road/High Bridge Road) during the closure.

You can bring: (fee next to item)

Household Goods and Clothes (free - donated to charity)

Lead-acid Vehicle & Marine Batteries (free)

Fluorescent Light Bulbs (50 cents each)

Passenger Tires (\$1 off rim / \$2 on rim)

Scrap Metal / Major Appliances (stove, washer, dryer, water heater, etc.) (free)

Electronics - computers, laptops, monitors and TVs, small fax machines & copiers, printers, scanners, phones, microwaves, keyboards, and more (free)

Oil, Oil Filters / Antifreeze (free)

Refrigerators / Freezers (\$20 fee)

Air Conditioning Units (\$35 fee)

Plant Pots & Packing Peanuts (**no other plastics**) (free)



There **WILL NOT** be any bulky garbage collection at the event this year.

DO NOT FEED THE WILDLIFE!

There has been an increase in raccoon and coyote activity in some of the neighborhoods in Duvall recently. They may be cute, but they can be dangerous.

The Department of Fish & Wildlife “*Living with Wildlife*” website says that “Humans increase the likelihood of conflicts with coyotes by deliberately or inadvertently feeding the animals, whether by handouts or by providing access to food sources such as garbage, pet food or livestock carcasses. When people provide food, coyotes quickly lose their natural fear of humans and become increasingly aggressive. They also become dependent on the easy food source people provide . Once a coyote stops hunting on its own and loses its fear of people, it becomes dangerous and may attack without warning.”



The website also recommends that you “Do not feed raccoons; Don’t give raccoons access to garbage; and Put food in secure compost containers and clean up barbecue areas.”
