Learn about local bird species and how to protect our feathered friends. Learn about bird communication and identification and find out about local bird-watching and wilderness opportunities.

**LID / STORM WATER STATION**

**WATERSHED STATION**

Beavers in Duvall? What types of native mammals live in your area and how do they co-exist with development? Learn to identify animals from pelts and bones.

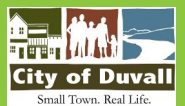
**GEOLOGY STATION**
