Community Safety Net:

Delivery for At-Risk Residents under Washington State “Stay Home – Stay Healthy” Order

In the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic and resulting “Stay Home – Stay Healthy” Order for all citizens in Washington State, the cities of Duvall and Carnation are jointly hosting a delivery request hotline. The goal is to ensure that citizens in the greater Carnation-Duvall community can request delivery of essential resources if they are unable to leave home or cannot get items delivered in another manner.

Individuals who are:

- In high risk groups for COVID-19 infection
- Physically unable to leave home
- Recuperating from illness or injury
- Unsure of their potential to infect others

are encouraged to reach out and request delivery of food, non-narcotic medications, durable medical goods or other essential items.

Many businesses, neighborhood groups, spiritual organizations, and local non-profits are already serving the needs of many individuals within our communities. Their wonderful work is ensuring that food and necessities are met. The goal of the Community Safety Net is to capture anyone outside those networks who find themselves in need of delivery to their home.

The requests are limited to items the caller has already purchased or received as a donation. Items must also be deemed essential. Once a request is made a representative will call back to confirm request and timeline for delivery. Volunteers from the Carnation Duvall Citizen Corps will be deployed to pick up requested items and deliver to recipient.
