Hoping other businesses will come out.

- Action Item: If any board members have ideas on programs or people/groups Kathleen can connect with, please let her know. The programs usually take 2-3 months lead time to put together. KCLS Duvall will start looking at setting the calendar for 2020 in the next few weeks.
- Action Item: Wendy Maimone to follow up with Kathleen O’Keeffe on including Medicaid in upcoming programs, especially to discuss the changes to Medicaid (breaking out into 5 different groups) and the coverage in regards to mental health.

- Develop outline for October 15<sup>th</sup> presentation to Duvall City Council
  - Action Item: Look at the presentation shared to the board, including the data, and discuss what we would like to present. Mary Cormstack suggested highlighting adult services and teen/family services so that we can show that we are hitting different populations. Denise suggested highlighting one or two activities and connect it back to one of the cities goals.


