Construction of the Centennial Project is proceeding nicely. In just the last few weeks the contractor completed the removal of aerial utilities, water main installation, and installed a portion of the new curb.

Other big items expected to be completed in early April include construction of the retaining wall, curb completion, landscaping, installation of improved lighting along the walkway and street, and paving.
