October is a busy month for our City. The administration presents the 2014 draft budget to the city council for their review. As I worked with the team, it became apparent that we have managed our expenses and we have seen a slight increase in our revenues. This is consistent with last year, and the year before that. A few highlights for 2014: I have proposed that we maintain the funding for our community grant program, we continue to fund our community events and that we keep the visitor center open for another year. I am confident that the draft budget will keep the level of service that all of us have relied upon over the years and maintain our reserves.

In addition to the budget, council and I are working hard on a capital facility plan. Our City has a number of properties that we may or may not need in the future. ## DID YOU KNOW THAT CAR WASHING CAN BE HARMFUL TO OUR WATERWAYS?

Outdoor car washing results in large amounts of dirt, road grime, oil, nutrients and heavy metals flowing into waterways as the detergent-rich water used to wash the grime off our cars flows down the street, into the storm drain and into the nearest body of water. Remember, it all drains to the river.

### HOW CAN YOU HELP PROTECT OUR WATERWAYS?

- Use commercial car-wash facilities. They are required to recycle and treat their wash water prior to discharging it to the sanitary sewer system. In the sewer system, the water is treated at the wastewater treatment plant before it is ultimately discharged to local waterways.
- Another alternative is to wash the car on a pervious surface such as a lawn or vegetated area so the wash water can soak into the ground, where pollutants are filtered out.

### CHARITY CAR WASHES

If you are planning a charity car wash you can:

- Sell commercial car wash coupons from local car wash companies. This allows you to sell tickets any time of year, expand fundraising beyond one event, and doesn't leave you dependent on the weather.

### Big Rock Road Sewer Improvement Project

Construction is planned to begin in October 2013 on Big Rock Road for the Sewer Main Improvement Project.

During construction Big Rock Road will be closed to traffic in both directions between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. Monday thru Saturday. Closure will occur between the 26800 block and 275<sup>th</sup> Avenue NE. A detour route will be in place.
