**RESOLUTION NO. 19-10**

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**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF  
DUVALL, WASHINGTON, APPROVING THE 2020-2025 6-YEAR  
TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP).**

WHEREAS, RCW 35.77.010 requires the legislative body of each city to annually prepare and adopt a comprehensive transportation program for the ensuing six years; and

WHEREAS, state law requires that the transportation program shall be consistent with the City's Comprehensive Plan; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has reviewed the 6-Year Transportation Improvement Program prepared by staff, identified transportation priorities, and determined that the Program is consistent with the capital facilities and transportation elements of the City's Comprehensive Plan; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with RCW 35.77.010, the City Council held a Public Hearing on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of June, 2019 and continued the Public Hearing on the 16<sup>th</sup> day of July, 2019;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DUVALL, WASHINGTON,  
DO RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The attached Exhibit "A", as depicted in Exhibit "B", is adopted as the 6-Year Transportation Improvement Program of the City of Duvall and incorporated by reference the same as though it were fully set forth herein.

Section 2. The City Clerk is directed to file a copy of this resolution with the Secretary of Transportation not more than thirty days after its adoption.






